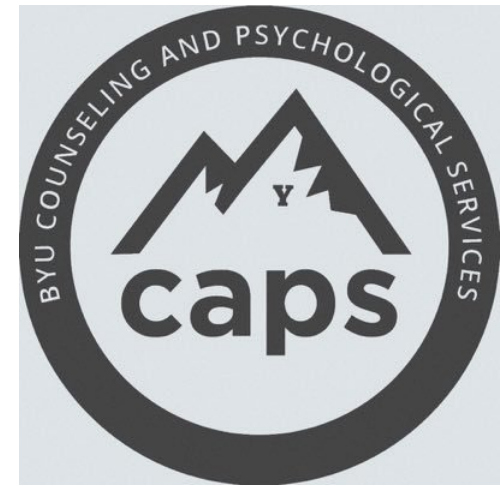


# Referral

## For students in crisis:



- BYU's Counseling and Psychological Services is open 8:00am to 5:00pm, Monday – Friday. If the student is in suicidal crisis \*walk them to CAPS (1500 WSC.)
- **\*COVID Protocol – Call 801-422-3035 and request to do a crisis session.**
- If after-hours or on the weekend, call:
  - University Police (801) 422-2222; their 24 hour dispatch will access an after-hours counselor
  - *Make sure that you identify that you are with a student who needs to speak with the **on-call CAPS counselor!!***

## **Campus Incident Report**

Because some members of the campus community and visitors may at times experience overwhelming stress or pressures that may cause individuals to respond in ways that threaten the safety of others in the community, the University has established a Campus Threat Assessment Committee. The Campus Threat Assessment Committee receives reports on individuals who may represent a threat to campus safety, assesses the level of the threat, determines what actions should be taken and monitors the results.

# Crisis Line Phone Numbers

- Utah State Crisis Line – 801-587-3000
  - Coordinates crisis response and has access to:
    - Recovery Outreach Center – Crisis counselors on duty
    - Mobile Crisis Outreach Team (MCOT) – Can send crisis team to other locations
- SafeUT App – search “SafeUT” on the App Store or Google Play.
  - Has both chat (text) and crisis phone line features.
